

Initial Consultation Report from Tara A. Fantauzzi Patregnani Professional Genealogist



Summary of Research Recommendations:

The purpose of this report is to summarize the data and goals for your project. Please review the information in this report carefully and report if any additional information is known at project start or if any of the information should be changed or corrected.

I reviewed notes regarding the identity of Margaret Doyle and a couple John and Bridget Doyle who may have been her parents, as well as an Ancestry.com member account with new information on Margaret Doyle. The new information from the Katy O'Toole Morton personal family tree reported that Margaret Doyle was born on the 29th of January 1807 to John and Bridget Doyle in a town referred to as Ballyshonog in County Wicklow. She was further described to have died on the 8th of February 1877 in Macton, Peel township, Wellington, Ontario, Canada, which is where and when our subject Margaret Doyle O'Toole is believed to have died.

Further analysis of the evidence from the Katy O'Toole Morton ancestry tree led me to search the name Margaret Doyle and the identities of her parents to determine what source was cited as proof of baptism and marriage for these subjects. I determined the sources are Roman Catholic parish records from Killaveny, Wexford and Wicklow County, Ferns Diocese, Ireland. I reviewed the dates of records as well as the style of records from this place and determined the earliest baptism and marriage records are from 1800 and run until about the 1860s-1870s. The format of the records is a one-line registration, which means that on the marriage record from 1802 from Killaveny for John and Bridget Doyle there would not be a description of the identities of any parents reported on the document.

To help conclusively prove the baptism record from 1807 and the marriage record from 1802 are a correct match for our family I recommend I apply up to two hours of research time completing a survey of Roman Catholic marriage records from the same parish of 'Killaveny' to find (1) proof of marriage for Margaret Doyle to Peter O'Toole, (2) proof of baptism for at least a son referred to as Peter O'Toole born circa 1842 and (3) proof of baptism for men who may be brothers to Margaret Doyle as described in the Initial Consultation Report dated 5-24-2019, " John Doyle, James Doyle, Patrick Doyle, John Bernard Doyle and Hugh Doyle who settled in Tecumseth township".

I also reviewed the following notes from Peter O'Toole: Tenents on Fitzwilliam Estate "Coolatin" County Wicklow, Departure to Ontario from Ireland on ship "Jessy" May 17, 1848, Patrick Toole (O'Toole), about 1803-1848, Ancestry headshot image is tenant farm location map near Ballyshonogue near Tinahely Margaret Doyle O'Toole, 1807-1877 February 8, parents maybe



John and Bridget (both born about 1780), "Widow Anne Toole" lived at the same location as Patrick and Margaret Doyle Toole (O'Toole), possibly Pat's mother, as identified on Coolatin clearances records ("estate notebooks"), In Ontario, Margaret Doyle O'Toole, is "said" to have lived with the family of her son-in-law Thomas Farrell (Mary Toole's husband) ship from Ireland to Canada was the "Jessie" not the "Jessy".
